The Howard dozen: top Montagny to try

Louis Latour

Beginnings as vine-growers in Aloxe-Corton in 1768, Maison Louis Latour was established in 1797 and is now a 50ha domaine and large négociant business with global reach. Louis Latour bottles two Montagnys, which are fermented in steel, undergo malolactic fermentation, and are aged 8-10 months in steel tanks. La Grande Roche is from vines located on higher, steep slopes and is hand-picked.

Louis Latour, La Grande Roche, Montagny 1^{er} Cru 2018 - 91 pts

Crisp, bright, unoaked premier cru Montagny with more than a little similarity to a warmer-vintage Chablis. Peach and ripe melon fruit flavours, combined with a succulent texture and saline, stony finish.
