- AVERAGE VINE AGE 35 years
- SOIL Clay and limestone.
- AVERAGE YIELD 30 hl/ha
- · HARVEST Hand picked

Vinification & Ageing

- FERMENTATION Traditional in open vats
- AGEING 10 to 12 months ageing in oak barrels, 100%
- BARRELS Louis Latour cooperage, French oak, medium toasted



The Mazis-Chambertin is just next to the Chambertin, at the heart of the constellation of Grands Crus from Côte de Nuits. There used to be an ancient hamlet which disappeared around the Middle Ages: in ancient french, 'Mazis' meant 'country houses'. It is an extraordinary red wine, powerful and complex. A wine just waiting to blossom.

Wine tasting

- TASTING NOTE This Grand Cru is a magnificent ruby red colour. Complex on the nose, the fruit overrides all else, cherry, cassis and blackberry. The barrel-ageing gives a certain smokey touch. Fat in the mouth with a liquorice finish.
- CELLARING POTENTIAL 10-15 years
- FOOD PAIRING Venison stew roasted deer with pepper and mashed celery mature cheeses.
- SERVING TEMPERATURE 16-17°
